

Competitions and handicaps

There are three apps of interest. BRS, Clubnet and Golf Ireland. You can set these up on your smart phone for easy access. However, for ease of use you can do everything you need to do via the Clubnet app as it links all the systems in one phone app.



BRS

The BRS system will continue to be used for booking tee times and payments for competitions using the electronic purse. Remember you need to sign in with the pro shop staff before you go out to play. You can access BRS via the BRS app, via the Clubnet app, or via the website www.rosslaregolf.com

Clubnet

For competitions and handicaps we are using the Clubnet phone app. If you select the members menu in the Clubnet app menu you will be brought into the Masterscoreboard website www.masterscoreboard.ie. Many of you will be familiar with Masterscoreboard. As before you will also be able to see competition results and see your handicap accessible via the app.

In addition, you can electronically enter scores for competitions via your phone. When logged into the Clubnet app, you will need to navigate to Members and then Digital Scorecard. Make sure you get your passwords set up for both Clubnet and Masterscoreboard so that you are ready to go.



You can also use your pc to access Masterscoreboard via www.masterscoreboard.ie
Previously we used a generic password 'pole' to enter this website. The first time you enter the new set up you may be asked for the old password and then to set up a new individual password.

Golf Ireland

The engine that controls your handicap index is the Golf Ireland Website. You can also see your handicap index via the Golf Ireland app. In addition you will have access to a history of your last 20 scores.

You can also enter a 'General Play Score' using the Golf Ireland app whether you are playing at Rosslare Golf Club or another affiliated golf course. With the present set up you cannot enter competition scores on line using the Golf Ireland app.

Like the other app there is website where you can access the Golf Ireland information
also. www.golfireland.ie
There is a log in area where you log in with your golf number and use the pin number on your old GUI/ILGU membership card as your initial password. You can change this password if you so wish. You will be able to see your playing history and your current handicap index as shown below.
